Lake-Sumter EMS has updated our combined CPR and ACLS Refresher program with an improved emphasis on hands on learning and an in-depth algorithm review. Attendees who wish to solely complete the CPR component can leave after they completed the BLS section at 1200; all ACLS participants must attend the beginning CPR component even if they just took a class. This meets the minimum ACLS criteria of the AHA.
